Purpose of GII



- Opportunity for community-generated ideas
- Engage organizations who normally don't participate in our RFP process
- Utilization of under-expenditures utilizing a simple application process
- Heighten CSC's awareness of other non-profit youthserving organizations and programs in the county
- Broadly amplify community awareness of CSC's commitment to children and their families

Streamlined Funding Process



- Brief Requests for Proposals (RFP)
- 6-page Proposals Submitted
- Read and Initially Rated by Review Team
- Review Team Discussion and Funding Decisions
- Payment Made as Grant
- Typically One Site Visit
- Project Completion and Financial Report at End of Year

Evolution of GII



- 2016 Started Great Ideas Initiative
- 2017 Modified eligibility criteria Added 15% for Administrative Costs
- 2018 Increased award amount from \$25,000 to \$50,000

Added Great Ideas Initiative Growth Fund for Capacity Building

- Strategic Plan Development
- Information Technology and Infrastructure
- Organizational Management
- Marketing and Fund Development



Eligibility Criteria

2018 Eligibility Criteria	Rationale
Has an annual operating budget of less than \$1 million dollars (Effective 2017)	Supports targeting smaller, community-based organizations who may not have capacity to compete with larger, more established organizations
In good standing with the IRS and registered with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to solicit funds.	Ensures organization is an active nonprofit organization with tax-exempt status and registered with FDoACS to ensure able to solicit funds
Has been doing business for two or more consecutive years	Serves as a barometer for measuring stability
Has not previously received a grant through Great Ideas Initiative for the same program (Effective 2017)	GII grant was not intended to be a sustainable funding stream for a program year after year.
Not currently receiving direct funding from CSC or through a designated Level 1 Lead Agency (BRIDGES or Parent-Child Home Program) (Effective 2017)	Adding this eligibility allowed for currently funded providers to seek and receive funding through other CSC funding sources.
Excluded Areas	Rationale
Hunger-relief efforts (Effective 2018)	CSC currently funds these services through its contracted agencies:
Swim lesson vouchers (Effective 2016)	 United Way of Palm Beach County Palm Beach County Food Bank Drowning Prevention Coalition of Palm Beach County Safe Kids Palm Beach County Friends of Youth Services and Palm Beach County
Special needs or children's safety equipment (Effective 2016)	
Summer camp scholarships (Effective 2016)	






- Funds for GII come from under expenditures 2016-2018 awarded \$1,982,061 to fund 70 initiatives
 - o 2016 \$509,747 to 24 Initiatives out of 138 eligible
 - o 2017 \$615,771 to 26 Initiatives out of 77 eligible
 - o 2018 \$856,543 to 20 Initiatives out of 33 eligible
- Great Ideas Initiative Growth Fund 2018 - \$283,716 to fund 6 Organizations' Capacity Building
